All children under 6 years of age are invited to join us for age appropriate activities when accompanied by an adult. Although the program is designed for children 3 and over, children under 3 are certainly welcome with their siblings.

On Rosh Hashanah, we all go across the street to the Muddy River for Tashlich, a ritual which allows us to cast our transgressions literally and figuratively into the river, following each of the late Services (last group leaves at 2:15 p.m.).
