

EFFECTIVE 11/1/ 09 - PARKING FAQs AT TEMPLE ISRAEL

1. Who owns the parking structure next to the Temple?

In 1987, our leaders determined that leasing out the vacant land on the opposite side of Nessel Way was the best option to ensure parking for our Temple members and a flow of income to support ongoing Temple operations. The Medical and Scientific Community Organization (MASCO) undertook a fifty-year ground lease, and constructed the office building and parking structure on that site.

2. Is parking free?

No, Temple Israel pays MASCO for parking. When you are at Temple for services, for programs, or for meeting with Temple staff, take a ticket at the garage and the front desk will validate it. If you are at Temple outside of pick up and drop off times for the schools, you can also park on Nessel Way – remember to get a parking pass from the front office and put it on your dashboard.

3. What does parking cost?

As of October 2008, the regular posted parking rates at MASCO are:

Evening hours are less: In after 3:30pm and out by 8:30 am next day - \$7 total

Weekend rates: In after 3:30pm Friday and out by 8:30am Monday - \$7 total

4. What special arrangements have been made for parents in the Religious School?

Drop Off Loop – 15 minutes

Designed for religious school parents, this drive through parking area providing 8 spots allows you to park quickly, run in and drop off or pick up your child, and depart quickly.

(It is unavailable during preschool drop off times but may be used for preschool pick up). These spots have a 15 minute maximum parking time limitation. The Temple pays MASCO an annual amount to maintain access to these spaces.

The Red Card System for Religious School

As part of the effort to provide more easy access and affordable parking for parents of children in the Religious School we offer a parking card for the garage which is active from 3:30pm onwards on Tuesdays and at any time on Sundays. It is not active at any other time. This card allows you to drop-off, stay for classes and schmoozing, and for pick-up. The Temple pays for each use of these cards at a fixed rate that is favorable to the Temple.

5. What special arrangements have been made for parents in the FJECC Preschool?

Pick Up Loop – 15 minutes

As mentioned above there are 8 spots in the drive through loop, but these may only be used for pick-up, not for drop off.

The Red Card System for Pre-school

Drop off and pick up for preschool parents occurs at the busiest time of days for the garage and are subject to their hourly rates listed above. As part of Temple Israel support for the preschool parents, parking cards for the garage are provided. They are active only for 45 minutes for pick up and drop off between the hours of 7:45AM and 3:15P, Monday through Friday only. Payment for that part of your stay which **exceeds** 45 minutes is your responsibility and must be made at the garage office, to the left of the exit gates, prior to returning to your vehicle.

6. As a pre-school parent, what do I do if I usually use a Red Card, but will be staying longer than 45 minutes for a preschool event?

When you anticipate staying longer than 45 minutes for a validated preschool event – please take a parking ticket rather than use your card.

- The preschool will provide validation for certain preschool events. You will be notified by the preschool office which events are validated and those for which you are responsible for paying parking.

A KEY EXCEPTION: If you will be here longer than 45 minutes on Friday for Shabbat Sing, take a parking ticket and the Temple will validate your ticket at the front desk.
