The Temple Israel Cemetery



The Temple Israel Cemetery was established in 1859, five years after the Congregation was founded. The acquisition of land in Wakefield was a highly significant investment, resulting in a rapid increase in Temple membership as the new Congregation became able to meet all the life cycle needs of its members.

The cemetery is a window on the history of Jewish Boston, recalling earlier traditions and practices, and honoring people whose family names are well known in the community. It is unique in its garden-like atmosphere that has been carefully nurtured and maintained throughout its history. In fact, the minutes of the 1910 congregational meeting note that "our cemetery, which is the most important adjunct of the congregation, is beautiful and everything in connection therewith is in the finest possible condition." Today, although Temple Israel now has many "important adjuncts," the cemetery remains part of the life cycle of the Temple and its member families.

The cemetery is open to visitors. From almost its beginnings there has been a tradition of having an annual community memorial service at the cemetery. This service is scheduled for Spring.

To reach the cemetery from Boston, follow Route 95 North to exit 57/Wakefield and go right onto North Street at the bottom of the exit ramp. Continue approximately three-quarters of a mile to Beacon Street on the left, a small street bordered by two cemeteries. Turn left on Beacon Street and park. The Temple Israel Cemetery is on the right side of Beacon Street.
